LOCAL LAW NO. 7-1977 CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

A Local Law to Amend Article 13, Section 13.20 of the Chautauqua Administrative Code in Relation to the Term of Office of the District Attorney

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, New York as follows:

SECTION 1. That Article 13, Section 13.20 of the Chautauqua Administrative Code be, and the same hereby is, amended as follows:

Section 13.01 *District Attorney*

There shall be elected from the County at large a District Attorney. The District Attorney shall be elected for a *four* (4) (three (3)) year term of office and, at the time of his election and throughout his term of office, shall be a qualified elector of the County and shall have been duly admitted to the practice of law in the State of New York. The District Attorney shall have and exercise all powers and duties now or hereafter conferred or imposed upon him by applicable law.

SECTION 2. This Local Law shall take effect on January 1, 1978
