LOCAL LAW NO. 2-1984 CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING THAT THE COUNTY OF CHAUTAUQUA WILL NOT ENFORCE THE NEW YORK STATE UNIFORM FIRE PREVENTION AND BUILDING CODE IN CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

This Local Law is in accordance with Article 18 of the New York State Executive Law, Laws of 1981, Chapter 707. Section 381(2) of the Executive Law allows the county government to adopt a local law "providing that it will not enforce the uniform code within the county".

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua as follows:

ARTICLE I.

The Chautauqua County Legislature hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Chautauqua County that the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code be administered in Chautauqua County by either the local governments or by the State of New York because (a) county-wide administration of the code would entail significantly higher inherent costs, (b) many local governments already have a mechanism to administer the code, and (c) local governments are in a better position to efficiently administer and enforce the code.

ARTICLE II.

Chautauqua County will not enforce or administer the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code.

ARTICLE III.

This Local Law shall be in full force and effect from and after January 1, 1985.
