LOCAL LAW NO. 7-1987 CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

AMENDING SECTIONS 13.00 AND 13.02 OF THE CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY CHARTER TO PROVIDE FOR A FOUR YEAR TERM OF OFFICE FOR COUNTY CLERK AND SHERIFF

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, New York as follows:

Section 1. The second sentence of Section 13.00 of the Chautauqua County Charter shall be amended to read as follows (new language underlined and deleted language in brackets):

The County Clerk shall be elected for a [three (3)] <u>four (4)</u> year term and, at the time of his election and throughout his term of office, shall be a qualified elector of the County.

<u>Section 2.</u> The second sentence of Section 13.02 of the Chautauqua County Charter shall be amended to read as follows (new language underlined and deleted language in brackets):

The Sheriff shall be elected for a [three (3)] <u>four (4)</u> year term of office and, at the time of his election and throughout his term of office, shall be a qualified elector of the County.

<u>Section 3.</u> This Local Law, subject to a referendum on petition in accordance with the Municipal Home Rule Law, shall take effect forty-five (45) days after adoption unless a referendum is required, in which case it shall take effect upon approval of the affirmative vote of the majority of the qualified electors voting on the proposition.
