

LOCAL LAW NO. 4-93
CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

A LOCAL LAW REGARDING PUBLICATION OF NOTICES OF ADOPTION OF LOCAL
LAWS BY THE CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY LEGISLATURE

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua as follows:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this Local Law is to modify and supersede the publication requirements of local laws, as set forth in Section 214(2) of the New York State County Law. It is the intent of this Local Law to provide reasonable notice of the passage of local laws by the County Legislature at the most economical cost.

Section 2. Publication of Notices of Adoption of Local Laws. Within ten (10) days after a local law has become effective pursuant to applicable law, the Clerk of the County Legislature shall cause a notice of adoption of such local law to be published at least once in each of the official newspapers of the County. Such notices shall contain an abstract of the local law which shall include the title, purpose, and general effect of the local law. The notice of adoption shall also include a statement that a copy of the entire text of the local law will be made available to any requesting party for review at the office of the Clerk of the County Legislature, Gerace Office Building, Mayville, New York 14757, with an individual copy to be provided, at no charge, to a requesting party upon request to the Clerk of the County Legislature.

Section 3. Exception. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Local Law, the County Legislature may direct that an individual local law be published in its entirety pursuant to provisions of the New York State County Law, in which case the requirements of this Local Law shall not apply.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Local Law shall become effective forty-five (45) days after adoption, or upon approval by a majority of the qualified electors in the event a permissive referendum is held in accordance with the Municipal Home Rule Law.
