TITLE: Authorize Acceptance of the Gun Involved Violence Elimination

("GIVE") Grant funds for 2025-2026

**BY:** Public Safety and Audit & Control Committees:

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) has awarded \$738,212 to Chautauqua County though multiple agencies for the Gun Involved Violence Elimination ("GIVE") initiative; and

WHEREAS, the agencies involved form the GIVE Task Force to reduce gun violence, drug offenses, and other violent crimes in the primary jurisdiction of the City of Jamestown and throughout Chautauqua County; and

WHEREAS, the funded GIVE partnership consists of the City of Jamestown Police Department, and the Chautauqua County agencies of the District Attorney, Office of the Sheriff and the Probation Department; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jamestown Police Department has been awarded \$309,980 of the total GIVE funding and will sign and administer a separate contract with New York State DCJS for its portion of said funding; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County's portion of the funds is \$428,232, the agencies will share the remaining funds as follows: \$278,300 to the District Attorney's office; \$113,432 to the Chautauqua County Office of the Sheriff; and \$36,500 to the Probation Department; and

WHEREAS, the amounts received in this term of the grant exceeded the amounts budgeted by offices of the District Attorney and the Sheriff in the 2025 Adopted Budget for each department; and

WHEREAS, the office of the District Attorney, Sheriff and Probation will include the balance to be spent in 2026 in their proposed 2026 budgets; and

WHEREAS, this program will run from July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County of Chautauqua accepts the grant funds and authorizes the County Executive to execute the GIVE Grant contracts with the New York State DCJS in the total amount of \$428,232 for the term of July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to make the following changes to the 2025 Adopted Budget:

WHEREAS, the County's negotiating team and DSACC have reached a tentative agreement for the period January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2029; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2.05(g) of the Chautauqua County Charter, the County Legislature must approve all labor contracts; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Legislature hereby approves the tentative agreement between the County and DSACC to include various language changes and, among other financial incentives:

- Wage increases of 4% for 2026, 4% for 2027, 4% for 2028, and 4% for 2029.
- Step increases, step eliminations, and equalization.
- Top step adjustment to reflect alignment with the law enforcement profession as well as to promote retention of senior Deputy Sheriffs;
