AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr. and Legislature Chairman Pierre E. Chagnon:

WHEREAS, the South and Center Chautauqua Lake Sewer Districts'(SCCLSD) wastewater treatment plant has seen dramatic improvement resulting from the conversion from mechanical aeration system to fine bubble aeration; and

WHEREAS, the study is necessary to verify the existing capacity of the wastewater treatment plant and transmission system, as well as to assess the plant's capability to manage increased volume; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Legislature is pursuing funding to upgrade the North Chautauqua Lake Sewer District's (NCLSD) wastewater treatment plant infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 104-25 authorized the county to apply for grants towards reviewing the capacity of the SCCLSD wastewater treatment plant; and

WHEREAS, the County successfully applied for a \$50,000 New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) "Engineering Planning Grant" (EPG) for an engineering study (Study) as a first step in addressing the plant capacity (Planning Grant #2261); and

WHEREAS, the estimated Study total cost is \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, the grant, to be issued to the County of Chautauqua, has a twenty percent (20%) local match; and

WHEREAS, the District currently has adequate funds available in the 2025 budget to cover the 20% local match; and

WHEREAS, the SCCLSD Board approved acceptance of the grant funds and allocation of matching funds, via inclusion of the grant in the treatment portions of its 2025 budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the County Executive of the County of Chautauqua is designated as the authorized County representative for the EFC grant and is authorized to execute an EFC EPG grant agreement and any and all other contracts, documents, and instruments necessary to bring about the Study and to fulfill Chautauqua County's obligations under the grant agreement; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Chautauqua County Legislature authorizes and appropriates a twenty percent (20%), ten thousand dollar (\$10,000) local match, as required by the Engineering Planning Grant Program, for the SCCLSD Wastewater Treatment Plant Capacity Study, plus such additional amounts in excess of the grant and matching funds as may be needed to complete the Study, from funds designated for such purpose in the SCCLSD budget; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Director of SCCLSD may increase this local Study match, within budget appropriations and/or through in-kind services, without further approval from the Chautauqua County Legislature; and be it further

WHEREAS, the County owns and operates the Chautauqua County Airport Jamestown in the Town of Ellicott in a manner that provides services and facilities on a non-exclusive basis for the general use of the public and to enhance current and future economic development in the County; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Aviation Administration is interested in a long-term lease of antenna and equipment space within the Robert H. Jackson Terminal Building at the airport; and

WHEREAS, the Airport Commission has considered and recommends the acceptance of the negotiated lease; and

WHEREAS, the revenue received from this agreement will be included in the 2026 Proposed Budget; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to New York State General Municipal Law §352(5), a public hearing authorized by Resolution 207-25 was held on September 24, 2025, and all persons appearing thereat were heard; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is authorized and empowered to execute an agreement with The Federal Aviation Administration, to lease antenna and equipment space within the Robert H. Jackson Terminal Building at the airport in conformance with FAA regulations and to include substantially the following terms and conditions:

- 3. <u>Payment</u>. Tenant shall pay annual rent to County in the amount of \$5,000 at the end of the Federal government fiscal year.
- 4. Other. As negotiated by the County Executive.

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County's transportation system, which includes roads and bridges, is essential to everyone and it contributes to economic development, job creation and to quality of life; and

WHEREAS, proper maintenance and funding are essential to keeping our roads and bridges in good repair; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County capital budget includes \$5,113,367 in CHIPS Funding for capital improvements; and

WHEREAS, New York State has adjusted the 2025-2026 CHIPS appropriations for Chautauqua County to \$6,708,551.63, which includes a \$1,204,302.33 cumulative rollover balance; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County capital budget includes \$1,289,501 in PAVE-NY funding for capital improvements; and

WHEREAS New York State has adjusted the 2025-2026 PAVE-NY appropriations for Chautauqua County to \$1,279,189.67; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County capital budget includes \$859,668 in Pave our Potholes (POP) funding for capital improvements; and

WHEREAS, New York State has adjusted the 2025-2026 POP appropriations for Chautauqua County to \$852,793.12; and

WHEREAS, New York State has recognized the need for additional funds due to extreme winter weather and it has appropriated funds under the Extreme Weather Recovery (EWR) Program in the amount of \$841,994.40; and

WHEREAS the County's budget should be amended to conform to these adjustments in funding; now therefore be it

TITLE: Resolution of the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua Imposing

General Sales and Compensating Use Taxes, Pursuant to the Authority of Section

1210 of Article 29 of the New York Tax Law

BY: Administrative Services and Audit & Control Committees:

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr. and Legislature Chairman Pierre E. Chagnon:

BE IT ENACTED by the County Legislature of the County of Chautauqua, as follows:

SECTION 1 Resolution No. 86-68, enacted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Chautauqua on May 10, 1968, shall expire and be deemed repealed on December 1, 2025; provided however, that all provisions of such Resolution No. 86-68, in respect to the imposition, exemption, assessment, payment, payment over, determination, collection, and credit or refund of tax, interest and penalty imposed thereunder, the filing of forms and returns, the preservation of records for the purposes of such tax, the disposition of revenues, and any civil and criminal penalties applicable to the violation of the provisions of such Resolution No. 86-68, shall continue in full force and effect with respect to all such tax accrued for periods prior to December 1, 2025 in the same manner as if such provisions were not so repealed.

SECTION 2. Imposition of general sales and compensating use taxes. There are hereby imposed and there shall be paid within this County all of the sales and compensating use taxes described in Article Twenty-Eight of the New York Tax Law as authorized by subdivision (a) of section twelve hundred ten of such law, at the rate of three percent.

SECTION 3. In addition to the sales and compensating use taxes imposed by section two of this Resolution at the rate of three percent, there are hereby imposed and there shall be paid in this County such sales and compensating use taxes at the additional rate of one percent, for the period commencing December 1, 2015, and ending November 30, 2027.

SECTION 4 Local options. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of this enactment or other law:

- (a) Motor fuel and diesel motor fuel described in subdivision (m) of section eleven hundred eleven of the Tax Law shall not be taxed at a rate of cents per gallon.
- (b) The clothing and footwear exemption described in paragraph thirty of subdivision (a) of section eleven hundred fifteen of the Tax Law shall apply to the taxes imposed by this enactment.
- (c) The residential solar energy systems equipment, installation service, and electricity exemptions described in subdivision (ee) of section eleven hundred fifteen of the Tax Law shall not apply to the taxes imposed by this enactment.
- (d) The commercial solar energy systems equipment, installation service, and electricity exemptions described in subdivision (ii) of section eleven hundred fifteen of the Tax Law shall not apply to the taxes imposed by this enactment.
- (e) The commercial fuel cell electricity generating systems equipment, installation service, and gas and electricity exemptions described in subdivision (kk) of section eleven hundred fifteen of the Tax Law shall not apply to the taxes imposed by this enactment.
- (f) Residential energy sources and services described in paragraph three of subdivision (a) of section twelve hundred ten of the Tax Law shall be exempt from the taxes imposed by this resolution.

SECTION 5. Taxes in addition to others. The taxes imposed by this enactment are in addition to any and all other taxes authorized or imposed under any other provision of law.

Twenty-nine of the Tax Law. The provisions of Articles Twenty-eight and Twenty-nine of the Tax Law and any provision of the Tax Law or other law that applies to such articles, relating or applicable to the taxes imposed by this enactment, including the applicable definitions, transitional provisions, limitations, special provisions, exemptions, exclusions, refunds, credits and administrative provisions, so far as those provisions can be made applicable to the taxes imposed by this enactment, shall apply to the taxes imposed by this enactment with the same force and effect as if those provisions had been incorporated in full into this enactment and had expressly referred to the taxes imposed by this enactment, except to the extent that any of those provisions is either inconsistent with or not relevant to the taxes imposed by this enactment.

SECTION 7. Effective date. This resolution shall take effect immediately; provided, however, that Sections 1, 2, 5 and 6 of this resolution shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on September 1, 1968; section 4(b) of this resolution shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on March 1, 2006; and section 4(f) of this resolution shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on December 1, 2007.

WHEREAS, the Office of Emergency Services was awarded funds from the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services in the amount of \$99,400; and

WHEREAS, this grant is for technical rescue to replace and upgrade gear for our building collapse response and other rescue capabilities; and
