Amend 2025 Budget to Implement Waterway Hazard Removal Using Interest Earnings from American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and 3% Occupancy Tax Reserve

At the Request of County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County (the County) received an award of \$24,649,420 in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding; and

WHEREAS, such funds have been invested on an interim basis; and

WHEREAS, the interest income earned from the invested ARPA funds is available to be utilized by the County and a procedure has been established for the ARPA working group to review the remaining project requests; and

WHEREAS, The Chautauqua County Department of Planning and Development, in partnership with the Department of Public Facilities, Division of Parks, seeks to fund a capital project for Waterway Hazard Removal; and

WHEREAS, this project will enable the completion of the Marden Cobb Waterways hazard removal project, leveraging additional tourism potential, and aligning with other planning and development goals of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Parks Commission and Chautauqua County Planning Board have reviewed this request and recommended its approval; and

WHEREAS, the Waterway Hazard Removal project has been reviewed by the ARPA Working Group and the County is pursuing the use of ARPA interest earnings to fund the project; and

WHEREA, the APRA Interest Earnings Account has a minimum balance of \$87,000, and the 3% Occupancy Tax Reserve has a balance of \$716,631.86 as March 26, 2025; and

WHEREAS, \$87,000 in ARPA Interest Earnings and \$63,000 in 3% Occupancy Tax Reserve Funding is being sought for this project, for a total project cost of \$150,000 for this phase of work; and

WHEREAS, a budget amendment is necessary to authorize spending for the project; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is hereby authorized to enter into any necessary agreements for the above-named project; and be it also

> RES. NO. 251-25 Amend Resolution 139-17 – Government Reduction Initiative (GRI) Plan for Chautauqua County

By Administrative Services and Audit & Control Committees: At the Request of County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, in 2009, the New York State Legislature adopted the "New N.Y. Government Reorganization and Citizen Empowerment Act," which revised the requirements for consolidating or dissolving local government entities in New York State; and

WHEREAS, in November 2016, Governor Andrew M. Cuomo announced the Municipal Consolidation and Efficiency Competition for local governments to compete for \$20 million in grant awards to spur local government consolidation and innovative restructuring initiatives; and

WHEREAS, the New York Local Government Efficiency (LGe) Program provides technical assistance and grants for intermunicipal projects targeting shared opportunities, cost savings, and delivery of efficient, quality services by supporting mergers, reorganization and/or sharing of municipal functions with local government partners or at a regional level, and consolidation or dissolution of municipal structures, and further offers various grant funding and incentive programs and a Local Government Resource Center; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Local Law 4-17 of the County of Chautauqua, the County is authorized pursuant to a duly adopted resolution to "provide assistance to other municipalities in Chautauqua County to accomplish the consolidation and dissolution of local government entities";

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 139-17, the County implemented a Government Reduction Initiative (GRI) Plan in furtherance of Town and Village government efficiencies; and

WHEREAS, the County wishes to continue its efforts to work alongside New York State by minimizing the layers of local government in order to reduce property taxes, improve the business climate, and spur economic development in Chautauqua County; and

WHEREAS, the County further wishes to encourage government efficiency initiatives among school districts and local government entities as defined by New York General Municipal Law § 750(13) (which includes, without limitation: towns, villages, sewer districts, water districts, and fire districts); and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that the County Legislature establish the parameters in which the County intends to provide such assistance; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Legislature hereby amends the RESOLVED clause of Resolution 139-17, in its entirety, to read as follows:

- 1. Government Efficiency Projects. The County may provide funding up to \$100,000 per year to any local government entity or school district considering, planning, or implementing: (a) dissolution, consolidation, or merger; (b) consolidation of public services or facilities; or (c) intermunicipal consolidations aimed at improving delivery of services. The County may require that local government entities and school districts match a portion of the funds to be received. Priority may be given to projects that will result in a reduction of total real property taxes.
- 2. State and Federal Grants. County payments or funding awards pursuant to this Resolution shall not result in a local government entity or school district's receipt of payments or funding in excess of the total cost of the funded project. Any payment awarded by the County may be reduced to an amount no greater than the difference between the cost of the project and the total amount of federal and state grant funding, except that the County may determine that no reduction will be made for the following:

  (a) state or federal grant funding to study potential dissolution or consolidation; (b)

  Citizen Empowerment Tax Credits; or (c) County payments to be utilized as a match to state or federal grant funds that assist a local government entity or school district in dissolution or consolidation.
- 3. <u>Agreements</u>. Subject to the appropriation of funds by the County Legislature, the County Executive is authorized and empowered to enter into agreements with local government entities and school districts to implement the provisions of this resolution.

January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2026 – approximately \$15.46 per square foot per year, for an annual rate of Nine Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty Two Dollars and 56/100;

January 1, 2027 through December 31, 2027 – approximately \$16.08 per square foot per year, for an annual rate of Ten Thousand Two Hundred Twenty Six Dollars and 88/100;

January 1, 2028 through December 31, 2028 – approximately \$16.72 per square foot per year, for an annual rate of Ten Thousand Six Hundred Thirty Three Dollars and 92/100; and

WHEREAS, CCLBC has all properties appraised as-is and lists them for sale at 60% of the appraised value in order to incentivize and maximize investment by the purchasers for the required renovation work; and

WHEREAS, based on historical sales, CCLBC has sold properties for approximately \$12,000 per property on average, and any 'profits' realized by CCLBC are being reinvested directly back into improving the County's housing stock through a range of activities including renovation, side lot disposition, and demolition projects; and

WHEREAS, CCLBC aspires to become self- sustaining as it builds its capacity over time; therefore be it

Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Director of Finance shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.
- <u>Section 7.</u> The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:
- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.
- <u>Section 8.</u> This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 9. This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary form in the official newspaper of such County, together with a notice of the Clerk of the County Legislature in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.
