Call to Order	The meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m. by Kidder.
Privilege of the Floor	Terrie Tremblay: My name is Terry Trembley. I am the owner of the former Panama Pizza that was in Panama, New York. I was responsible for doing the water testing every day to verify that the water was safe with the chlorine levels. It was not water that was consumed by the public, but it was used for my cooking. And I did the testing every day. I wrote it down on the sheet. I thought I had I took a picture of May's test on June 5th. I was going - I was going through a lot of emotional stuff at that time and physical challenges and I had taken a picture of the report and I thought I sent it like I always did and I didn't send it. My pizza shop closed up on June 21st. So, I didn't realize because I was closed that I needed to file June's report. I thought because we closed prior to the end of the month and I ended up having to leave town for a month and when I got the notification in the mail I was not here. So, I didn't realize that I needed to correspond with them. I had tried to and then when he got the letter, I tried to call but by then it was too late and the fine – the hearing was already implemented. I took my pizza shop responsibilities very serious. The health of the community is very serious to me and I'm sorry that I failed in my responsibilities at not reporting. I did the report. I did the work, but I didn't send the email. And a fine of that amount right now would be very financially threatening to me. The pizza shop is closed. The last day of operation where we sold to the customers was on June 21st and I will not be opening

Privilege of the Floor cont'd	another establishment in the future. I never had a bad water report. Everything was always within guidelines, but I failed to send the report.				
	Ketcham: Over what period of time were your reports always on time, how long was the shop open? Terrie Tremblay: I opened on July 10th of 2024. Ketcham: So over 20 years?				
	Terrie Tremblay: No. No. I was I was open not quite a year. I have the dated picture on my phone of the date I took it. It's the same date that I signed it which was June 5 th . I went into the email and didn't push send, so I'm sorry.				
	Kidder: Any other questions? Thank you for coming and sharing your experience with us, we will take that into account, thank you.

Old Business:	Lacey provided an update regarding wind turbine research. One of the Public Health Fellows was asked to research the topic and put together some information that will be reviewed and presented to the Board at the November 2025 meeting.				
	Jessica answered questions regarding the Lead Rental Registry program. We are still awaiting guidance and regulations from NYS. The Lead Team has already begun preparing and planning with the City of Jamestown in anticipation of more information from the State.				
New Business: Agreements to Settle	Agreements to settle were reviewed. As usual, there were several public water supply violations. These are facilities failing to submit their monthly water report and water monitoring results.				
Hearing Officer Recommendations:	Hearing Summary:				
recommendations.	In the matter of Panama Pizza, the petitioner, Chautauqua County Board of Health, was represented by attorney, Heather Hoden, Assistant County Attorney. The Respondent, Terrie Tremblay, appeared and proceeded without counsel. After hearing the testimony, the Hearing Officer found the Respondent has violated Title 10 N.Y.C.R.R. Part 5, Sub-Part 5-1.72(c)(1) on two (2) occasions in she failed to submit a copy of the daily operations records for reporting periods of May 2025, and June 2025, by the 10th calendar day of the month following each reporting period. She has also violated Section 5-1.51(b) (Table 11) for failing to submit, by July 10, 2025, the results of the microbiological minimum monitoring requirements for the Second Quarter of 2025, and that she has violated Section 5-1.51(Table 8c) for failing to submit, by July 10, 2025, the results of minimum nitrate monitoring requirements for the Second Quarter of 2025. It is the recommendation of the Hearing Officer that the Chautauqua County Board of Health

impose a penalty of \$400.00 in total for all four (4) violations against the Respondent as permitted by New York State Public Health Law.

Discussion Summary:

The Board of Health, after review and discussion, 1 opposed and 6 voted in favor of reducing the Hearing Officer's recommended penalty amount to \$250.00 with a clause that the Board recognizes this is a unique situation and that payment of the penalty is required before a new facility can be opened in the future.
