System for Technology Upgrades to Courtrooms

AT THE REQUEST OF: County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, the County has an interest in promoting the rule of law and supporting court modernization efforts in Chautauqua County, State of New York; and

WHEREAS, the mission of New York State Unified Court System is to promote the rule of law and serve the public by achieving just and timely resolution of all matters before the courts; and

WHEREAS, the courtrooms in the Chautauqua County Courthouse located at 3 North Erie Street, Mayville, New York 14757, have no capability to use media equipment and needs to be modified with new courtroom presentation equipment and infrastructure, which includes, but is not limited to: (a) high-definition monitors situated within arms-length of every party, the judge, and the jury; (b) HDMI compatible devices and back-end network equipment for the display of evidence; (c) witness monitors which have touch screen capabilities, allowing for marking or telestration of digital exhibits; (d) new courtroom speakers, allowing for amplification of audio evidence to the court, all parties and the jury; (e) new cameras in the front and back of the courtroom allowing video capture of the judge, witness, attorney tables and podium (where/when applicable) to enable hybrid courtroom appearances via video conferencing as well as to enable the ability to live stream court proceedings if required or deemed necessary to do so; (f) wireless microphones to support attorney mobility and jury selection; (g) an easy-to-use evidence control system; and (h) assistive technologies for individuals with hearing or vision limitations; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Unified Court System requires each District Attorney's Office in the State to contribute to the costs of upgrading courtrooms; and

WHEREAS, the County District Attorney's Office is required to contribute One Hundred and Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000.00) spread over four years; and

WHEREAS, the County District Attorney's Office will use grant funding available through the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services Aid to Prosecution program to completely cover its contribution for the purchase of equipment for said upgrades to the three courtrooms in the Chautauqua County Courthouse; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Unified Court System will cover all additional purchase and installation costs associated with this upgrade; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the County Executive is hereby authorized and empowered to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the New York State Unified Court System for purposes of improving technology in the three courtrooms in the Chautauqua County Courthouse.
