Support Bemus Point Central School District Application for New York
State Local Government Efficiency Implementation Grant

By Public Facilities Committee:

At the Request of Chairman Pierre E. Chagnon and County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, the Department of State of the State of New York has made funding available for the 2025-2026 Local Government Efficiency Program to assist applicants in implementing plans to increase local governments cooperation and consolidation efforts to reduce costs to their taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the Consolidated Funding Application is a unified funding process developed and made available to distribute grant funds to incentivize new actions between local governments that will reduce the cost of municipal operations and modernize the delivery of local services, thereby limiting growth in property taxes and increase efficiencies in service delivery; and

WHEREAS, the Bemus Point Central School District ("District") and County of Chautauqua ("County") find it advantageous to join together in seeking a Local Government Efficiency (LGE) Implementation Grant from the NYS Department of State to allow the District to decommission its existing wastewater treatment plant located on the Maple Grove High School property and construct a pump station and force main to the County's existing public sewer system within the South and Center Chautauqua Lake Sewer District, thereby improving administrative efficiency, reducing operational costs, modernizing services and enhancing intermunicipal cooperation; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is consistent with the goals and requirements of the LGE Implementation Grant program; and

WHEREAS, the Bemus Point Central School District will act as the lead applicant and the County will act as co-applicant; and

WHEREAS, the application will seek \$560,000 in total monies, \$500,000 in a Department of State LGE Implementation Grant, and \$60,000 from the Bemus Point Central School District in required matching funds (at least 10% match required); now therefore be it

Jamestown Airport to Archies Airport Diner, LLC

WHEREAS, the County owns and operates the Chautauqua County Jamestown Airport in the Town of Ellicott in a manner that provides services and facilities on a non-exclusive basis for the general use of the public and to enhance current and future economic development in the County; and

WHEREAS, Archies Airport Diner, LLC has shown an interest in leasing the restaurant space within the terminal building for the purpose of operating a restaurant and events catering business; and

WHEREAS, the Airport Commission has considered and recommends leasing restaurant space in the airport terminal building to Archies Airport Diner, LLC for the purpose of operating a restaurant and events catering business; and

WHEREAS, this revenue is included in the 2026 Budget so an amendment is not needed; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is authorized to execute a lease agreement with Archies Airport Diner, LLC for the restaurant space at the Chautauqua County Jamestown Airport upon substantially the following proposed terms and conditions:

1. Term One year, commencing on March 1, 2026, and terminating on February 28, 2027 with the option to negotiate renewal at the end of the term.
2. Premises Chautauqua County Jamestown terminal building restaurant space comprising 2,909 gross square feet of open floor plan office. County, at no additional cost to Lessee, shall provide for the use of parking adjacent to the Terminal Building next to restaurant door entrance directly to the outside.
3. Payment Tenant shall pay County a monthly fixed rental fee of Nine Hundred and No Dollars (\$900).

Authorize Intermunicipal Agreement with the City of Dunkirk for
Installation Costs of Public Safety Camera System

By Public Safety and Audit & Control Committees:

At the Request of County Executive Paul M. Wendel, Jr.:

WHEREAS, General Municipal Law 119-o authorizes municipalities to cooperate in the performance of their activities; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County was awarded a New York State Aid to Prosecution grant through the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services with the purpose to offset expenses incurred by prosecutorial offices during the prosecution of violent felony offenses; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County District Attorney has determined that public safety camera capabilities at critical locations within the City of Dunkirk supports the purpose of the grant by assisting with crime deterrence, criminal and traffic investigations, emergency response, and serve as a force-multiplier in efforts by the City of Dunkirk (hereinafter “City”) to achieve its law enforcement and public safety objectives, providing real-time intelligence to police officers and other first responders; and

WHEREAS, the City has already purchased and partially installed public safety cameras (hereinafter “Camera System”) and has entered into a Purchase Agreement with DFT Communications Corporation (hereinafter “DFT”) for the purchase, installation, and provision of said services; and

WHEREAS, the Camera System project description is as follows: placement of six cameras at major intersections located in the City to monitor traffic in those locations and assist law enforcement when an incident occurs; and

WHEREAS, the balance due to DFT under the terms of the Purchase Agreement between the City and DFT is \$36,760.33, which the County wishes to utilize its Aid to Prosecution grant funds to pay the balance thereof, and to additionally pay for electrical contractor charges on behalf of the City so installation of the Camera System can be completed by DFT; and

WHEREAS, the County shall in consideration for said funding be provided by the City access to surveillance footage generated from the Camera System to aid with prosecution of criminal cases and access to “real-time” footage for emergency situations, law enforcement purposes, and for any other County-related matter as may be requested; and

WHEREAS, this expense was not included in the 2026 Adopted Budget for the District Attorney’s office; now therefore it be

RESOLVED, the County Executive is authorized to execute an intermunicipal agreement with the City of Dunkirk for the Camera System project as described above; and be it further

RESOLVED, that Section I Rule 3(A)(9) of the Rules and Regulations of the Chautauqua County Legislature is hereby amended to read as follows: "Privilege of the floor for members of the Legislature and members of the public to speak on any matter relevant to the powers, duties, and/or responsibilities of the County Legislature, or of the County Government in general, in consideration of the County's authority pursuant to State law and the Chautauqua County Charter. This privilege shall extend to any person appearing for himself in which case each individual appearing shall be limited to three minutes; and to persons representing any group in which case there shall be allowed only one spokesman for the group, who shall be limited to a maximum time of five minutes."

Affordability Act of 2026

At the Request of Legislators Bankoski and Nelson:

WHEREAS, residents of Chautauqua County continue to struggle with high gasoline prices, escalating food prices, increasing property taxes, inflation that stubbornly continues around 3% and increasing health care costs that make it difficult to afford to live here, and

WHEREAS, the majority in the Chautauqua County Legislature in 2024 refused to raise the income limit for the Senior Citizen partial property tax exemption from \$30,000 to almost \$38,000, and

WHEREAS, residents of Chautauqua County pay an 8% sales tax that is much higher than our neighbors and business competitors in Erie County and Warren County Pennsylvania, and

WHEREAS, the 8% sales tax has produced ever-increasing revenue to the Chautauqua County treasury at a rate above inflation, and

WHEREAS, the County has made do with a sales tax rate less than 8% for most of the past 57 years since the sales tax began, and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Legislature just raised County property taxes for 2026 by almost \$2,000,000, and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Legislature has it within its power to make living in Chautauqua County more affordable; therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Chautauqua County Legislature will use \$2,000,000 of its Unappropriated Fund Balance (approximately \$35,000,000) to lower County property taxes in 2027 from \$75,000,000 in 2026 back to the \$73,000,000 in 2025; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Chautauqua County Legislature will make more senior citizen homeowners eligible for the senior citizen partial property tax exemption by raising the income eligibility from \$30,000 to \$38,000; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Legislature intends to seek State Home Rule Legislation reducing the County Sales Tax to 7 ³/₄% and to share more of the extra ³/₄% sales tax with our cities, towns and villages.

Amend Senior Real Property Tax Exemption

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County has offered a partial real property tax exemption since 1967 to senior citizen homeowners whose incomes are below a certain level as set by occasional resolution; and

WHEREAS, the current \$30,000 income limit has not been modified since 2024 and as a result, several senior citizens who were once eligible for the exemptions are no longer eligible; and

WHEREAS, New York Real Property Tax Law section 467 authorizes an income ceiling of up to \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, it is proposed that the income limit be increased to \$38,000 effective as of the next taxable status date (March 1, 2026); therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that effective as of the next taxable status date (March 1, 2026), the County of Chautauqua does hereby increase the income eligibility limit to \$38,000 for partial real
