Pursuant to the New York State EL. 3-212 and ss 15.09 of the Chautauqua County Administrative Code, we submit the Board of Election's Annual Report for the calendar year of 1977.

The political year began with Central Voter Registration, (EL. ss 355(1)) for the purposes of the 1977 Annual Report on Thursday, December 2, 1976.

June 7th was the first day for circulating Designating Petitions. Dates for filing such petitions were between July 5th and 7th for the September 8th (Thursday) Primary Election. As a result of such action there were Primary candidates for Town and Legislative offices. The nine-town canvass of the voting machines was completed by noon on September 12, 1977. The results were as follows for public offices:

*Opportunity to Ballot is more commonly known as a write-in vote on Primary Day. It permits the Party Enrolled Voters to write in the candidates they wish to represent them in the November Election.

Only 27 Election Districts were open on Primary Day. Busti with 8 Election Districts had the only two-Party primary thus complicating the voting machine setup for the Custodians.

This is the fifth Primary Election that permitted absentee voting since enactment in 1974.

The expansion of services and costs that are placed on Boards of Elections by Federal, State and/or Court decisions is a major problem. This office is one of the largest offices in County Government that receive absolutely ZERO DOLLARS to carry out the mandates of these august bodies.

Concomitant with ss 5-406 of the Election Law, and ss 5-400 which mandates a Purge List begun in the second week in December and be completed not later than the third week in the succeeding January. All permanent records and data related to the more than 68,616 enrolled voters have to be individually examined to verify if the registrant has voted at least once in a General Election during the past two years. All those that have not must be notified by mail.

The cancellation of these registered voters occurs when they fail to fill out, sign and return the re-instatement request form within three weeks of the post-mark on the notification. After this three-week interval, the newly compiled list of Registered and Enrolled Voters is then sent to the printer, pursuant to EL. ss 5-604 in conjunction with the need of EL. ss 8-100 concerning Primary Elections. Such lists must be printed prior to the First of March in which there is a Spring Primary. Our efforts to process this data is impeded by EL. ss 5-302(4) which states that we cannot open the entire year's enrollment until the Tuesday following the General Election, and the process must be completed before the first day of February of the succeeding year.

Registration records under Section 5-612 and 15-118 of the Election Law are used for Village and School District Elections. Election Law ss 15-118 states, if such village does not require Permanent Personal Registration, they (Village Inspectors of Elections) shall adopt or copy such names from the registration lists certified and supplied by the County Board of Elections to the extent applicable. Unfortunately only 3 villages, i.e., Celoron, Fredonia and Lakewood village lines conform to the Town Election Districts. Thus the inspectors in the other 12 villages must be knowledgeable where the legal village/town lines are in order to extract the registrants.

Furthermore, any qualified elector may register centrally or by mail until 10 days before (EL. 5-200) an election, i.e., March 5 or Fredonia on March 4. This office must then forward those village registrants to such clerks immediately for the March election.

Since September 1, 1973 all 15 County Village Elections are conducted under Article 15 (formerly Article 17). The Election Officer is the Village Clerk (EL. 15-124). In addition to supplying voter registration lists, the Board of Elections is involved by publishing Village Election Calendars, supplying information of office and vacancies up for election (EL. 4-106), canvassing voting machines upon candidate request, and such Election Law and procedures as are germane. Individuals who are registered with the Board of Elections under P.P.R. are automatically qualified to vote in Village elections. Conversely, an individual who registers to vote under the Village registration system is NOT automatically qualified to vote in a November General Election. This person must personally register again under P.P.R. or use the newly enacted mail registration in order to vote in a November General Election. Thus, many village residents are confused and disenfranchised by this dual system when they attempt to vote in a November Election.

At least 8 months before the General Election, each County, City, Village, and Town Clerk, pursuant to EL. ss 4-106, shall make and transmit to the Board of Elections a certificate stating each County, City, Village, and Town Officer respectively, to be voted on at the General Election. Within 3 days after the occurrence of any vacancy in an office required to be filled at the next General Election, such clerk shall file with the County Board of Elections a certificate indicating the occurrence of the vacancy and the position which is to be filled. A vacancy occurring before September 20th of any year must be on the November Ballot (Public Officers Law ss 42).

Any proposal, proposition or referendum as provided by law that is to be submitted to a vote of the people shall be transmitted to the Board of Elections (EL. 4-108(b)).

The concentration of such information in our office generates many inquiries throughout the year concerning Election Law, Petitions, Party Caucus, Primaries, General Elections, A.B.C. local option, Referendum, Special Elections, School Board Elections, Fire Districts, etc.

Although this office does not, in accordance with law, have anything to do with the printing of petitions, we are deluged with questions on proper ways to execute them. This office frequently receives from various individuals seeking public office questions of procedure. It is our advice to these individuals to seek the aid of legal counsel in order to avoid any possible complexities; despite this advice office seekers are disqualified and/or resort to Court action after the fact!

These petitions are filed with the Board of Elections. Those persons on whose behalf petitions have been filed are then notified and they can accept or decline the designation. At this point it has to be established whether or not a Primary Election would occur in any of the offices and, if so, prepare for it.

This office has now completed our sixth annual voter registration drive within the high schools of Chautauqua County and other areas. Positive response to this effort is shown in the figures shown below which give a six-year total for comparison. Such registrants are informed of absentee voting, impending School Board Elections, Primaries, special elections and the November General Election.

High school voter registration and field registration is conducted by our permanent staff and temporary help which we use to train many Election Inspectors. The results were as follows:

Some 500 candidates for public offices began circulating petitions on June 7, 1977. The filing dates were between July 5th and 7th. The last day to authorize the designation of an unenrolled member to accept or decline was July 11th and the last day to fill any vacancies was on July 14th. During the five-day period of July 25th -- 29th our staff registered 244 people at the County Fair.

The Board of Elections administered the Oath of Office to the Election Inspectors of Jamestown and Dunkirk on July 20th in their respective City Halls, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. A total of 204 Election Inspectors were eligible to take the Oath of Office.

The City of Dunkirk held a Special City Charter Election on Tuesday, August 2nd in all 16 Election Districts. The Board of Elections certified that on Thursday, August 4th, 1977 as follows:

Based on the City of Dunkirk 1977 Enrollment of 7,660 registrants, 33.99% went to the polls. A total of 5,057 did not.

This is the fourth year that the State and County Board of Elections are held responsible for candidates filing financial statements.

Due to changes in the law and financial report forms, staff members have been to Albany State Board of Elections seminar dealing with these complexities. We have a filing capacity for 621 candidates and committees.

In preparation for the Primary and General Elections a School of Instructions for Election Inspectors and Alternates was held in the Hall R. Clothier Building auditorium. A total of 6 afternoon and evening classes were held from August 29th through August 31st. A total of 491 persons attended the six classes. All

Election Inspectors are entitled to be paid \$5.00 per day and mileage at the rate of 15¢ per mile for attending such school (EL ss 49a-1). These amounts will change somewhat under Recodification (EL ss 3-412, 3-420).

A centralized school of instructions permits the use of office equipment, supplies, and a voting machine. Written examinations were administered to all of these inspectors and covered many of the recent changes in the Election Law.

Tremendous state-wide confusion resulting in State Legislature passage of amendments to Section 60 and 60A of the TOWN LAW which removes town justices as voting members from Town Boards with the expiration of terms ending in 1977 and 1979.

This confusion covered the entire spectrum such as; conflicts with Political Calendar; voters suddenly confronted with voting of ANY two councilmen; voting machine custodians in setting up the machines; election inspectors in how to check the machines; problems of over-designation of candidates; vacancies in Justice position and many others. Fortunately, our anticipation of these and many other problems were covered at the Schools of Instructions. The State Board of Elections Memo to Election Commissioners on 11-14-77 revealed the extent of the problem in other counties. All of these problems were further complicated by the New York State Legislature passage of a bill which would have delayed implementation of changes to EL 60 and 60A. The Governor vetoed this bill on June 28th just before the filing dates of July 5th through the 7th.

All Town and City Clerks were notified on September 1st of the Board of Elections recommendation (EL ss 416), the consolidation of some polling places for registration on Saturday, October 8th and 15th from 1:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. This decision was based on a large citizen response to Central Registration and the apparent interest in mail registration.

Due to the time schedules mandated by the New York State Election Law, unusually heavy demands have been made on the County Printing Department by this office. For example, EL ss 5-602 mandates the printing of voter registration lists for each of the new local registered voters of October 8th and 15th.

Furthermore, EL 5-200 stipulates that a qualified person could move up to and including October 29th, thus changing his address and possibly the election district. Therefore, accurate registration lists must be printed after this date.

This office mandated per EL 5-602 for the distribution of lists not less than six days prior to the day of election, Wednesday, November 2nd. EL ss 5-602 (3) compels distribution of Registration Lists before the 6th day to the State Board of Elections.

Election Law section 394 states the Board of Elections, not less than 15 days nor more than 30 days before the first day of Local Registration (October 8th) shall conduct a Mail Check of every registered voter. This entails processing 73,168 letters to the 132 Election Districts, printing 132 different letters, and notifying the registrant that such communication is a routine check to ascertain whether such voter still resides at this address. Within one week after the conclusion of Local Registration the Board of Elections shall send a similar communication 1,495 letters to every voter registered in such Local Registration period.

At this point, pursuant to the EL ss 16-108(5), this Board calls upon law enforcement agencies to investigate questionable declared and actual voter residency.

Whenever such communication is returned as undeliverable, the Board of Elections forthwith shall proceed in accordance with the powers granted to it by EL ss 5-402, 5-404, 5-400 to determine whether such registration of the affected person shall be cancelled. Such legal determinations were made and verified in the 23 days prior to Election Day on November 2nd.

This is the third year all New York State Boards of Election are mandated by Law to obtain "unofficial" results the night of Primary and General Elections, (EL ss 9-126 (2b)).

The November 8th election presented a far greater problem in reporting the "unofficial" results than the previous election, a presidential one. This is

due to the far greater number of candidates, more than 500, in a local election. All 35 incoming telephone lines were used and manned by volunteers. Our staff of twelve, plus 35 volunteers received the results by phone and conducted running totals for all State-wide questions and propositions and candidates. A total of 108 electric adding machines were used.

Voter participation is less in Local "off-year" Elections even though there are many more candidates:

The day following the General Election this office received the election supplies which were returned from all of the 132 Election Districts, the bulk of which was received before noon.

Traveling bi-partisan teams consisting of permanent employees began the canvass of the voting machines and verification of the results as recorded by the Election Inspectors. This physical inspection was completed by the following Friday at 5:00 p.m. At this time temporary help is needed annually to process the voluminous statistics in order that this office may certify the results within the mandated time.

On December 1, 1977 the Recodification of the Election Law went into effect.

The purge of voters, due to not voting during the past two years, moving etc, was completed on December 19, 1977.

This office is in reality, an office of vital statistics of the most current information available on a county-wide basis. Each and every month pursuant to EL 5-400, 5-708, this office receives from the public recording officers of the 15 villages, 27 towns, and 2 cities, the deaths in their respective areas in order that we may remove the deceased person from the current registration list. The continual updating of names and addresses as mandated by the Election Law of Chautauqua County residents in our office results in many requests for information from the Courts, FBI, Social Security Administration, attorneys, private agencies, and individuals.

This office is one source of names and addresses to the Federal and County Courts for use as potential jurors. In fact, this office provides many such services for several County Departments.

On December 1, 1975 Registration and Enrollment by mail first went into effect. In order to facilitate voter registration these forms are now available at the Clerk's office of the two cities, 15 villages, and 27 towns.

During the 1977 political year some 25,500 mail registration forms were distributed to candidates, party workers, etc. Many "citizen" groups promised faithfully to conduct effective voter registration drives. Only 7.7% of these forms were returned!
