Pursuant to the New York State Election Law, sections 3-212(4), and 15-09 of the Chautauqua County Administrative Code, we submit the Board of Election's Annual report for the calendar year of 1981.

The political year began with Central Voter Registration, (E.L.ss 5-200) for the purposes of the 1981 annual report on Friday, December 5, 1980.

Few people realize that our county is the 18th largest in population of the 57 counties located outside of New York City. Thirty nine counties are smaller! All election expenses must be paid by the county. The Board of Elections is undoubtedly the largest unit of County government that receives mandates from the Courts, Federal and State governments with Z E R O dollars of support!!!

Concomitant with E.L.ss 5-400. ss 5-406 mandates a Purge List to begin in the second week in December and be completed not later than the third week in the succeeding January. All permanent records and data related to the 70,979 enrolled voters have to be individually examined to verify if the registrant has voted at least once in a general, primary, or special election during the past four years. All those who have not must be notified by mail.

The addressing of 4145 purge cards to individuals due to their not voting during the past two years was completed on December 19, 1980, for mailing on January 2, 1981. A total of 831 (17.6%) returned their cards by February 6, 1981 for re-instatement. The remaining 3,314 on February 6th under E.L.ss 5-406(2) were notified in another mailing that their voter registration was cancelled. The purge was increased from 2 to 4 years beginning December 1, 1981. This should minimize the removal of Registered Voters that vote only in Presidential Elections.

The cancellation of these registered voters occurs when they fail to fill out, sign and return the re-instatement not later than the third week in January. On February 6th, this office mailed 3,314 voter cancellation cards E.L.5-406(1) In January, the newly compiled list of Enrolled Voters is then sent to the printer, pursuant to E.L.ss5-604 in conjunction with the need of E.L.ss 8-100 concerning Primary elections. Such lists must be printed prior to the first day of March in which there is a Spring Primary.

Our efforts to process this data is impeded by E.L.ss 5-302(4) which states that we cannot open the entire year's enrollment (except Special Enrollment) until the Tuesday following the General Election and the process must be completed not later than the 30th day preceding the last day to publish enrollment lists. Registration records under E.L.ss5-612 and ss 15-118 are used for Village and School District elections. Election Law ss 15-118 states if such village does not require Permanent Personal Registration, they (Village Inspectors of Elections) shall adopt or copy such names from the registration lists certified and supplied by the County Board of Elections to the extent applicable. Unfortunately, only 4 villages, i.e., Brocton, Celoron, Fredonia, and Lakewood village lines conform to the Town election districts. Thus the Inspectors in the other 11 villages must be sufficiently knowledgeable where the legal village/town lines are in order to extract the registrants to be placed on the registration rolls for Village elections.

Since September 1, 1973, all of the 15 County Village Elections are conducted under Article 15 of the Election Law. The Election Officer is the Village Clerk under section 15-124 of the Election Law. In addition to supplying voter registration lists, the Board of Elections is involved by publishing Village Election Calendars; supplying information of the office and vacancies which are up for general village election per E.L.4-106,15-104, and V.L.3-3-2; canvassing voting machines upon candidate request E.L.ss 15-126(3), and such Election Law and procedures as are germane.

Fourteen villages had Registration on February 28th and Fredonia on February 21st. The village election day was on March 17 (St. Patrick's Day) with the exception of Fredonia which was March 9th. Village candidates for office had this schedule:

Furthermore, any qualified Village elector may register centrally or by mail until 10 days before (E.L.ss 5-200) an election, i.e., March 7th or Fredonia on February 27th. This office must then forward those village Supplemental Registration Lists to such Clerks immediately for the Tuesday, March 17th election (Fredonia, March 9th).

Financial reports are required from the village candidates where there is a population of 5,000 or more residents in the village (EL. 14-124(6)). Only Fredonia

meets this category. However, unless the aggregate receipts of said candidate and his authorized committees, or the aggregate expenditures made by such candidate and his authorized committees exceed \$1,000 such financial reports must be filed irrespective of population. [Rules & Regulations State Board of Elections ss6200(1&2)]

Board of Elections registrants are automatically qualified to vote in Village elections. Conversely, an individual who registers to vote under the Village and School registration system is NOT automatically qualified to vote in a November General Election. Such person must personally register again under P.P.R. or use the mail registration forms in order to vote in a November General Election. Thus, many village residents and school voters are confused and disenfranchised by this registration system when they attempt to vote in a November Election.

This office set up several voting machines for the March 1981 Village Elections due to absence or sickness of custodians. On Village Election day, several voting machine and election problems were serviced by our Staff.

Under E.L.15-126(3), Forestville candidates requested a canvass of the Village results by the Board of Elections. Such canvass was conducted on March 19th and certified the following day.

At least 8 months before the General Election, each County, City, Village, and Town Clerk, pursuant to E.L.ss 4-106, 15-104 and V.L.ss 3-302 shall make and transmit to the Board of Elections a certificate stating each County, City, Village, and Town officer respectively, to be voted on at the General Election. Within 3 days after the occurrence of any vacancy in an office required to be filled at the next General Election, such Clerk shall file with the County Board of Elections, a Certificate indicating the occurrence of the vacancy and the position which is to be filled. A vacancy occurring before September 20th of any year must be on the November ballot (P.O.L.ss 42) that year.

Any proposal, proposition or referendum as provided by law, that is to be submitted to a vote of the people shall be transmitted to the Board of Elections E.L.ss 4-108(b) at least 29 days prior to the Election by the Clerk of a County, City, Town, Village, or special district, at an election conducted by the Board of Elections.

The concentration of such information in our office generates many inquiries throughout the year concerning the Election Law, petitions, party caucus,

primaries, general elections, A.B.C., local option, referendums, special elections, school board elections, fire districts, June State, National and September Judicial Designating Convention.

In the month of May, this office completed its Tenth annual voter registration drive within the high schools of Chautauqua County and other areas. Positive response to this effort is shown in the figures below which gives a ten year total for comparison. Such registrants are informed of enrollment, absentee balloting, impending School Board elections, Primaries, Special Elections, and the November General Election.

High School voter registration and field registration is conducted by our permanent staff and/or temporary help which we use to train many Election Inspectors. The results were as follows:

The Board of Elections administered the Oath of Office to the Election Inspectors of Dunkirk and Jamestown on July 13 and 14 in their respective City Halls between the hours of 10:00A.M. and 4:00P.M. In Dunkirk, there are 64 Inspectors of Elections not including the Alternates. In Jamestown, there are 140 inspectors not including alternates. A two city total of 204 Election Inspectors were eligible to take the oath of office.

Special South and Center Sewer District Registration Days (for unregistered voters) were held on Wednesday June 24 at the Fluvanna Fire Hall from 2-9 P.M. and at the Chautauqua Mall on Thursday June 25, from 2-9 P.M. The Election was held on July 15 from 6A.M. to 9 P.M. involving 17 Election Districts. The canvass of voting machines was conducted on July 16th.

Drawing for positions on the primary ballot was held on August 11, involving 11 candidates.

In preparation for the Primary and General Election, a School of Instruction for Election Inspectors and Alternate Inspectors was held in the Hall Clothier Building Auditorium. A total of six afternoon and evening classes was held with a total of 511 persons attending

All Election Inspectors and Alternates shall be paid not less than \$5.00 for each training session and mileage not to exceed the rate approved by their respective municipality for attending such school (E.L. ss3-412, 3-420).

A centralized school of instructions permits the use of office equipment, supplies, and voting machine. Written examinations were administered to all new inspectors and which covered the Election Law.

This office conducted the 10th Primary Election that permitted absentee voting since enactment in 1974.

A total of 92 Election Districts were involved in the Primary held on Thursday September, 10, 1981. The hours were from noon until 9 P.M. Primaries by Party are: Republican Clymer, French Creek, Gerry and opportunity to ballot in Harmony and Jamestown Ward 6.

Democratic Westfield, Ripley, Chautauqua, Mina, Sherman, North Harmony, Clymer, French Creek, Pomfret, Poland, Ellery, and Gerry (all opportunity to ballot)
Conservative Artkwright, Hanover, Sheridan and Villanova (all opportunity to ballot)

A total of 19 Absentee Ballots were sent and 16 were returned. Sixty-two Military Ballots were sent and 2 were returned.

New Postal savings were achieved by having lighter weight ballots and envelopes weighing less than one ounce.

The last date for requesting regular absentee ballots by mail (EL ss8-400.2C) in person (EL ss 8-400.2 C) by September 8. This office finished canvassing all 131 voting districts by September 11, and certified such results to Albany.

On the 15th of September, 67,995 (47,799 addressograph + 20,196 computer) pre-sorted mail check cards at 10¢ each (total cost \$7,479.45) were sent to registered voters. This mandate (EL 5-712) notifies the voters of the days and hours of local registration and general election and the fact the registrant must reregister if such person has moved.

This year only 48 places of Voter registration were open from noon until 9PM. Such authorized consolidation is a direct saving to the 27 towns and 2 cities.

**This report requirement is waived if the 27 Day Post-Primary Report is required and submitted, containing the information required to be filed in the October 2nd report.

In addition to the above filing dates, financial statements shall also be filed on the 15th day of January, and July (6200.2) of each subsequent year until such time

as the candidate or committee terminates activities. The cut-off date for accounting purposes is the 11th day of the appropriate month.

Due to the time schedules mandated by the New York State Election Law, unusually heavy demands have been made on the County Printing Department by this office. For example, EL ss 5-602 mandates the printing of supplemental voter registration lists for each of the new local 1,176 registered voters of Oct. 10th and the 3,508 mail registrants received by October 5, 1981, must be finished by October 28, six days before the election.

Furthermore, EL ss 5-200(2) stipulates that a qualified person could move up to and including October 23, thus changing his address and possibly the election district. Therefore, accurate supplemental registration lists must be printed quickly in this 3 day work period.

This office is mandated by EL ss 5-602 (3) for the distribution of such lists before the sixth day that the General Election occurs. The date this year was October 28, 1981.

The Presidential Election interest is evident also in these categories for various ballots issued in November for several years:

This is the seventh year all New York State Boards of Election are mandated by law to obtain "unofficial" results the night of Primary and General Elections, (E.L.ss 9-126(2B)). This required the use of 87 electric adding machines "borrowed" from various departments within the County Court House. Our staff of twelve was augmented by volunteers using thirty-five telephones to receive the unofficial results.

The day following the General Election this office received the election supplies which were returned from all of the 131 Election Districts, the bulk of which received before noon.

Traveling bi-partisan teams consisting of permanent employees began the canvass of the 151 voting machines and verification of the results as recorded by the Election Inspectors. This physical inspection was completed by the following Friday at 5:00 P.M. Certified copies of Election results were finished and mailed (E.L.ss 9-214) prior to the 25 day deadline after election. The various offices were to be filed with the State Board of Elections, Attorney - General and Secretary of State.

On Wednesday, December 9th, a county wide election on Reapportionment (Proposition 1, Introductory L.L.#8 of 1981) was held. The results were:

Supplies were returned by noon Thursday. Separate canvassing teams finished canvassing the 131 districts by 5:00 P.M. Friday.

This office has just completed its fourth year under Recodification of the Election Law Chapter 233 Laws of 1976 with the effective date being December 1, 1977.

This office is in reality, an office of vital statistics of the most current information available on a county-wide basis. Each and every month pursuant to E.L.ss 5-400, 5-708, this office receives from the public recording officers of the 15 villages, 27 towns, and 2 cities the deaths in their respective areas in order that we may remove the deceased person from the current registration list. The continual updating of names and addresses as mandated by the Election Law of Chautauqua County residents in our office results in many requests for information from the Courts, FBI, Social Security Administration, attorneys, private agencies, and individuals.

Contrary to common belief, this office is not the only source of names to Federal and County Courts for use as potential jurors. In fact, this office provides many services for several County Departments.

On December 1, 1975, Registration and Enrollment by mail first went into effect. In order to facilitate voter registration these forms are now available at the Clerk's office of the two cities, 15 villages, and 27 towns. This office received and processed 3,508 registrants by mail during the 1981 Registration and Enrollment year.
