Pursuant to the New York State Election Law, sections 3-212(4), and 15-09 of the Chautauqua County Administrative Code, we submit the Board of Election's Annual report for the calendar year of 1984.

The political year began with Central Voter Registration, E.L. ss 5-200 for the purposes of the 1984 annual report on Wednesday, December 7, 1983.

Few people realize that our county is the 18th largest in population of the 57 counties located outside of New York City. Thirty-nine counties are smaller! All election expenses must be paid by the county.

Concomitant with E.L. ss 5-400,ss 5-406 mandates a Purge List to begin in the second week in December and be completed not later than the third week in the succeeding January. All permanent records and data related to the 81,427 enrolled voters have to be individually examined to verify if the registrant has voted at least once in a general, primary, or special election during the past four years. A total of 5,131 were removed before January 15, 1985. The notice of cancellation as mandated by E.L. ss 5-406(2) contains an application for personal registration by mail.

In January, the newly compiled list of Enrolled Voters is sent to the printer, pursuant of E.L. ss 5-604 in conjunction with the needs of E.L. ss 8-100 concerning Primary elections. Such lists must be printed prior to the first day of March in which there is a Spring Primary and are used in Village and school elections.

Our efforts to process this data is impeded by E.L. ss 5-302(4) which states that we cannot open the enrollment box (except Special Enrollment) until the Tuesday following the General Election and the process must be completed not later than the 30th day preceding the last day to publish enrollment lists. Registration records under E.L. ss 5-612 and ss 15-118 are used for Village, School District, and Fire District Elections upon the request of the fire Commissioners.(see ED.L. ss 1906, ss 2014, ss 2606). Election Law ss 15-118 states of such village does not require Permanent Personal Registration, they (Village Inspectors of Elections) shall adopt or copy such names from the registration lists certified and supplied by the County Board of Elections to the extent applicable. The Inspectors in six villages must be sufficiently knowledgeable where the legal village/town lines are in order to extract

the registrants to be placed on the registration rolls for Village Elections.

Board of Elections registrants are automatically qualified to vote in Village elections. Conversely, an individual who registers to vote under the non-personal method in the Village and school registration system is NOT automatically qualified to vote in a November General Election. (The only exception is the village of Celoron which has adopted Permanent Personal Registration). Such persons must personally register again under P.P.R. or use the mail registration forms in order to vote in a November General Elections. Thus, many village residents and school voters are confused and disenfranchised by this non-personal registration system when they attempt to vote in a November General Election.

Fourteen villages had Saturday registration on Saturday, March 10th and Fredonia on Friday, March 2nd. The village election day was on March 20th with the exception of Fredonia which was Monday, March 12th. Village candidates for office had this schedule.

Furthermore, any qualified village elector may register centrally or by mail until 14 days before (E.L. ss 15-118) an election, i.e., March 6th or Fredonia on February 27th. This office must then forward those village Supplemental Registration Lists to such Clerks immediately for the Tuesday, March 20th election (Fredonia, March 12).

Financial reports are required from the village candidates and/or committees where there is population of 10,000 or more residents in the village, or an expenditure of more than one thousand dollars E.L. ss 14-124(6). Only Fredonia meets this population category. However, unless the aggregate receipts of said candidate and his authorized committees, or the aggregate expenditures made by such candidate and his authorized committees exceed \$1,000 such financial reports must be filed irrespective of population. (Rules & Regulations State Board of Elections ss 6200 1 & 2)

Due to the 1980 Census and the resulting reapportionment, nine villages now have all of the Election Districts wholly within the village. They are: Lakewood, Mayville, Celoron, Falconer, Silver Creek, Forestville, Fredonia, Brocton and Westfield.

Since September 1, 1983, all of the 15 County Village Elections are conducted under Article 15 of the Election Law. The Election Officer is the Village Clerk under ss 15-124 of the Election Law. In addition to supplying voter registration and Permanently Disabled voter lists, the Board of Elections is involved by publishing Village Election calendars; supplying information of the office and vacancies which are up

for general village election per E.L. 4-106, 15-104, and V.L. ss 3-302; canvassing voting machines upon candidate request E.L. ss 15-126(3) and such Election Law procedures as are germane.

Under E.L. ss 15-125(3) candidates may request a canvass of the Village results by the Board of Elections. A request was made for the Village of Silver Creek and a canvass was conducted in 1984.

At least 8 months before the General Election, each County, City, Village, and Town Clerk, pursuant of E.L. ss 4-106, 15-104, and V.L. ss 3-302 shall make and transmit to the Board of Elections a certificate stating each County, City, Village, and Town offices respectively, to be voted on at the General Election. Within 3 days after the occurrence of any vacancy in an office required to be filled at the next General Election, such Clerk shall file with the County Board of Elections, a Certificate indicating the occurrence of the vacancy and the position which is to be filled (E.L. ss 4-106(4)). A vacancy occurring before September 20th of any year must be on the November ballot (P.O.L. ss 42) that year.

The concentration of such information in our office generates many inquiries throughout the year concerning the Election Law, petitions, party caucus, primaries, general elections, A.B.C., local option, referendums, special elections, school board elections, fire district, State, National, and September Judicial Designating Convention.

On Tuesday, April 3, 1984, (two weeks after the March 20 Village elections), a Democratic Presidential Primary Election was held from noon until 9 P.M. This office conducted the 13th Primary Election that permitted absentee voting since enactment in 1974. Presidential candidates and eighteen 34th Congressional District Delegates to the Democratic National Convention were on the ballot. Voter turn-out was as follows:

The last date for requesting regular absentee ballots by mail for the April 3rd primary was March 27. The first mailing of ballots (domestic and overseas) was made on March 2, 1984. The United States Justice Department requires that absentee ballots must be mailed no later than thirty days before the election.

Primary voting machine and custodian supplies were delivered on Wednesday, March 28, 1984.

The canvassing of the 131 voting machines was completed by 5 P.M. on Friday, April 6th.

In the month of May, this office completed its thirteenth annual voter registration drive within the high schools of Chautauqua County and other areas. Positive response to this effort is shown in the figures below which give a twelve year total for comparison. Such registrants are informed of enrollment, absentee balloting, impending School Board elections, Primaries, Special Elections, and the November General Election.

High School voter

registration and field registrations are conducted by our permanent staff and/or temporary help which we use to train many Election Inspectors. The results were as follows:

The Board of Elections administered the Oath of Office to the election inspectors of Dunkirk and Jamestown on August 16 and 17, in their respective City Halls between the hours of 10:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. In Dunkirk, there are 64 inspectors of Elections not including the Alternates. In Jamestown, there are 140 Inspectors not including Alternates. A two-city total of 204 Election Inspectors were eligible to take the oath of office.

In preparation for the Primary and General Election, a School of Instruction for Election Inspectors and Alternate Inspectors was held in the Hall Clothier Building Auditorium. A total of six afternoon and evening classes was held with a total of 530 persons attending.

All Election Inspectors and Alternates shall be paid not less than \$5.00 for each training session and mileage not to exceed the rate approved by their respective municipality for attending such school E.L. ss 3-412, 3-420.

A centralized school of instructions permits the use of office equipment, supplies, and voting machine. The State Board of Elections' written examinations were administered to all new inspectors and alternates and to those individuals who have not attended this school within the past five years (E.L. ss 3-412(1)).

On the 23rd day of August, 75,785 computer pre-sorted mail check cards at 9.3¢ and 23 at 11¢ (total cost \$7,050.53) were sent to registered voters. This mandate (E.L. ss 5-712) notifies the voters of the day(s) and hours of local registration and General Election and the fact the registrant must re-register if such person has moved.

The computer cut-off date for this mailing was August 17th. The first group of undeliverable cards, consisted of 5,424 cards at a cost of \$1,084.80.

Each of the mail check card mailing contained this statement; "If you or any registered member of your family are Physically Disabled OR will not be in Chautauqua County on ELECTION DAY, you may apply and vote by absentee ballot". This timely reminder caused an immediate response for absentee ballot applications. The same statement, with similar results, was contained in all legal ads.

A 73% reduction in postal costs was achieved through an amendment to E.L. ss 8-400(4) and 15-122(4) effective August 1, 1984, which allowed absentee ballots sent to the permanently physically disabled by first class, instead of certified mail. The last date for requesting regular absentee ballots by mail for the September 11th Primary was September 4th (in person by September 10th).

A fortuitous and timely change in Chapter 213, Laws of 1984, concerning E.L. ss 4-106(5) permitted a reduction in the number of polling places in time for the September 11th Primary. Only 9 of the 131 polling places were open. The office of the Board of Elections was one polling place for the Towns of Chautauqua, Ripley, and Westfield for the 13 Right-to Life registrants. Not one of the 13 eligibles voted in this opportunity-to-ballot for the Right-to-Life Party position for Congress!

The four party primary caused many different ballots to be printed in small quantities. The political parties had wide ranges of voter turn-out.

In addition to the 8 county Congressional Right-to-Life opportunity -to-ballot (write-in), the Conservative Party had 13 write-in committee positions and no one voted in ten of those positions! Also, petitions were filed in three other committee positions where no one voted.

The consolidation of polling places required the notification of polling place changes to the Liberals, Conservatives and Right-to-Life registrants. Such notices must be mailed, first class not later than 10 days nor more than 15 days before such election E.L. ss 104(5).

This office finished canvassing all 9 voting districts by September 13th and certified such results to Albany. This is the 14th Primary Election that permitted absentee voting since enactment in 1974. The last date for requesting regular absentee ballots by mail for the September 11th Primary was September 4th (in person by September 10th).

Registration lists with enrollments have to be printed for the Election Inspectors use (E.L. ss 5-502) for the October 4 and 13 local registration days. The computer cut-off date was 9-26-84. Due to the short time schedules mandated by the New York State Election Law, unusually heavy demands have been made on the county printing department by this office, for the printing of such lists. There were 82,870 registrants in 131 election districts in this printing.

This year, 19 townships, the cities of Dunkirk and Jamestown again opted to consolidate the number of registration places to 47 from noon until 9 P.M. for October 4 and 13. In a Presidential year, a county of our size must have 2 days of registration and the last day is set by the State Board Of Elections. This reduction in registration polling places results in a direct cost savings to those municipalities. Registration results are;

Within one week after the last day of local registration, this office is required to mail check cards, deleting the primary information. This mailing on October 26, consisted

of 9,290 cards. Of this number 5,602 were mail registrations forms received since the last mailing plus 3,688 local registrants.

There were 3,068 November 6 absentee ballot requests with 2,664 returned. All absentee ballot requests on hand were mailed on October 5 thus meeting the 30 day Justice Department requirement for Special Federal Voters. Effective December 1, 1984, such ballots on hand must be mailed 32 days before each general or primary election E.L. ss 11-204(4).

Any proposal, proposition or referendum as provided by law, that is to be submitted to a vote of the people shall transmitted to the Board of Elections E.L. ss 401(b) at least 29 days (October 8) prior to the election by the Clerk of a County, City, Town Village, or special district, at an election conducted by the Board of Elections. In order for this office to meet the Justice Department schedule, this office must have such questions early in order to print that absentee ballot once in that municipality.

The Supplemental Voter Registration lists must be printed for each of the 3,688 local registrants and the 5,602 mail registrations received since the last printing by Tuesday, October 30 (E.L. ss 5-602). The computer cut-off date was 10-13-84.

Furthermore, E.L. ss 5-200(2) stipulates that a qualified person could move up to and including Friday, October 26th, thus changing his address and possibly the election district. Therefore, accurate supplemental registration lists must be printed quickly within this short work period. This office is mandated by E.L. ss 5-602(1) for the distribution of such lists before the sixth day before the General Election occurs. The date this year was October 30, 1984.

Voter participation in the November 6, 1984 election was more than previous years but was less than the Presidential Elections of 1976 and 1980.

This is the tenth year all New York State Boards of Election were mandated by law to obtain "unofficial" results the night of Primary and General Elections, (E.L. ss 9-126(2B)). This required the use of many electric adding machines "borrowed" from various departments within the County Court House. Our staff of twelve was augmented by volunteers (mainly Mayville High School seniors) using thirty-five telephones to receive the unofficial results.

The day following the General Election this office received the election supplies which were returned from all of the 131 election districts, the bulk of which were received before noon.

Traveling bi-partisan teams consisting of permanent employees began the canvass of the 163 voting machines and verification of the results as recorded by the Election Inspectors. This physical inspection was completed by the following Friday at 5:00 P.M. Certified copies of election results were finished and mailed (E.L. ss 9-214) prior to the 25 day deadline after election. The various offices were to be filed with the State Board of Elections for the November 6, 1984, General Election. They were President & Vice President, Justice of the Supreme Court, Congress, State Senator, and Assembly of 149th and 150th.

The printing costs for this year's three elections for absentee/affidavit ballots; machine sample ballots; sets of ballot labels; primary cards and side cards are as follows:

April 3- Presidential Primary (one party-county wide)	\$1,920
September 11- Primary-4 party (consolidated-9 polling places)	\$3,389
November 6-General Election Ballot	\$8,645

The following are some items of interest.

- 1) Of the 131 polling places, only 16 have no handicap access. This is down from 27 polling places in 1983.
- 2) The Election Commissioners decided on August 31st, 1984, to count all absentee in the Board of Elections pursuant to Chapter 251 Laws of 1984.
- 3) The Board of Elections has filing capacity for financial statements for candidate and committees totalling 621. Financial statements shall be filed on the 15th day of January and July 6200.2b) of each subsequent year until such time as the candidates or committee terminates activities. The cut-off date for accounting purposes is the 11th day of the appropriate month.
- 4) The annual four-year purge conducted under E.L. ss 5-406 revealed :

- 5) In connection with each and every Primary, Special and General Election, this Department has to administer, instruct and distribute data to more than 550 employees (i.e. Election Inspectors, Voting Machine Custodians) in the 131 Election Districts throughout the County.
- 6) Although this office does not in accordance with law, have anything to do with the printing of candidate petitions, we are deluged with questions on proper ways to execute them. Our recommendation is to hire a competent attorney. Most of these petitions are filed with the County Board of Elections. Those persons on whose behalf petitions have been filed are then notified and they can accept or decline the designation. Then it has to be established whether or not a Primary will occur in each of the offices and if so, prepare for it.
- 7) The expenses of the Board of Election for the year under E.L. ss 4-138, and certified to the Clerk of the Legislature revealed the following for December 15:
