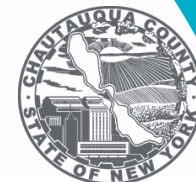

What is a CCBHC? Certified Community Behavioral Health Center

Created to provide comprehensive and integrated behavioral health care through various services emphasizing recovery, wellness, trauma-informed care, and the physical integration of behavioral health. Cost: Most insurances are accepted, including Medicaid and Medicare. Personal rates are determined using a sliding fee scale based on family income and ability to pay.



Accreditations

The New York State Office of Mental Health (OMH) and the New York State Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS) license the outpatient behavioral health programs. These programs meet federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) CCBHC certification requirements.
