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


Restorative Practices

The following principles reflect the values and concepts for implementing restorative practices.

- 1. Acknowledges that relationships are central to building community.
- 2. Builds systems that address misbehavior and harm in a way that strengthens relationships.
- 3. Focuses on the harm done rather than only on rule-breaking.
- 4. Gives voice to the person harmed.
- 5. Engages in collaborative problem solving.
- 6. Empowers change and growth.
- 7. Enhances Responsibility.

Restorative Practices Looks Like:

INTENSIVE: Restorative Conferencing and circles, **Restorative plans and** agreements

TARGETED: Problem -Solving Circles , peer mediation, restorative

Rebuilding **Relationships**

Repairing **Relationships**

UNIVERSAL: Daily community circle, student -led norms/rules, teaching SEL skills, Restorative language (affective questions and statements), effort toward building relationships, check in/check -out




